

Nazima Raghubir is a print and broadcast journalist based in Guyana. She has been in the media all her working life as a writer, reporter, managing editor and news presenter with stints at Prime News, as editor of “Insight” public affairs journal, and as a stringer/correspondent and fixer for several regional and international news organisations.

In 2018, she became the first woman to head the now 81-year-old Guyana Press Association and in 2020 she was elected to head the Association of Caribbean Media Workers which represents national media associations across the Caribbean. Ms Raghubir remains Vice President of ACM, a position was elected to in 2023. Additionally, she sits on the Board of the Media Institute of the Caribbean and the University of Guyana Broadcasting Trust.

Ms Raghubir has also authored and edited several print and multimedia productions including a published guide to the Parliament of Guyana, documentaries covering development and human rights issues, and numerous conference presentations. Among these are the State of the Caribbean Media Report which was produced by the ACM and funded by IFEX and A Situation Report on Misinformation and Disinformation which was produced by the Public Media Alliance with support from UNESCO.

In her native Guyana, she is viewed as a reliable resource for the mentoring of new and young journalists and as a supporter of human rights.
